HISTORICAL MEMORY, POLITICAL ACTION & NETWORK CULTURE



This course investigates similarities between the young, middle-class radicals of the Red Army Faction and America's Weather Underground in the 1960s and 70s. It explores how California counter-culture informed internet culture and asks whether Anonymous (today's loosely associated network of hackers, hoaxers, and whistleblowers) is a modern-day equivalent to RAF and AWU. We'll learn that indignation, militancy, and civil disobedience online can play constructive and harmful roles in social change.
