In addition to the academic seminar (3 credits), students will study Khmer, Cambodia's national language (2 credits) and complete a fieldwork-based project in partnership with local community organizations in Siem Reap working on issues of education, poverty, healthcare, and housing (3 credits).

Admission Priority

Eugene Lang College students with a 3.3 minimum GPA, 60 or more credits earned before the program start date, prior experience in community development or work with NGOs, and enrollment in LEDU3510/Cambodia in Spring 2014.
